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President's Letter

September

School has begun and that gives us hope that the weather will cool off sometime soon. Despite the heat, we had a great time at the August meeting collecting input from the membership about what they like / dislike and hope to see soon in a program. The discussion was so robust, that many did not even finish the questionnaire. I hope that we hit some of your favorites this year. We have new tools, new ways to use old tools, new mediums (for some of you) and new inspiration on the schedule for the year. We are still connecting the dates with instructors so the schedule will be up soon. We will

schedule a fall bazaar at our November meeting so you can offer your work to the rest of the guild for gift items. That means that you should be working on them now.

We have moved the letter intensive work to the Newbie workshops so that there is sufficient time to work through a complete hand. At this point we have Italic, Pointed Pen Variations, and Foundational on the schedule. We also heard from you that you want an open play date, so we will schedule one early in December so that you can take advantage of the time and supplies to create cards and / or gifts for the holidays. In July we will schedule a play date for various types of decorated paper. These are of course subject to instructor availability.

There was no international conference scheduled for 2011. As a result the IAMPETH conference was full with a wait list. A lucky few from Kaligrafos were able to attend the IAMPETH conference in Phoenix Arizona this summer. I am certain that it was not cooler on the outside thermometer and maybe not inside with all the hot information that was being shared. Come and live vicariously through the report of those lucky ones who got their registration in immediately. This has also made the 2012 conference in Portland already full with a wait list. As many things can happen between now and next summer, if you even think that you want to go, I'd suggest getting on the wait list. You too might get lucky.

Do not forget that the first workshop this fall is Design with Georgia Deaver. Regardless if you are experienced or a new calligrapher, design is an aspect that affects everything that you create from elaborate broadsides to small cards. Sign up now to learn from an experienced calligrapher who has worked in the calligraphy field commercially and, I might add, successfully.

Our *ABC, All Things Texas* books are finished. Now we will focus on getting them into the hands of the public. We have a fall bazaar set up for October 29th at the First United Methodist Church in Allen. This bazaar came well recommended so we will put our best foot forward and see how it goes. I hope that you will consider placing your work for sale alongside our books. Kaligrafos gets 10% of sales as a commission. Many of you have signed up to help, but I still need a few more helpers to letter the books and bookmarks.

We were a bit late in attempting to get on the schedule for many of the more popular bazaars so this will be the schedule for the fall of 2012.

The Dark Side

When laying colors down on an art piece place the lighter colors down first. You can always come back and darken later if needed, but it's more difficult to lighten a dark piece.

Correction

There are many advantages to using gouache as opposed to ink. The variation of colors are endless. And gouache sits on top of the paper instead of bleeding into the paper making it easier to correct mistakes using a scalpel or Exacto blade to trim off the mistake. With ink the simplest mistake remover is an eraser – preferably an electric eraser with a white pencil eraser attached. You will have to make several passes on the mistake, but be sure you don't erase hard or long enough to burn a hole in the paper.

Harvey's Helpful Hints



Underlines

An easy way to have lines on your art is to use "Underliners" attached to the back side of your art paper when using a light table. Underliners are clear plastic sheets with lines drawn on them in various spacings to accommodate different size nibs. They come in 6 sizes: fine to B4. Once you use them they are indispensable...you won't have to draw pencil lines then come back and erase the lines. I have a few sets available.

NOTE: We stock many vintage nibs, handmade pen staffs and have calligraphic DVD's available at the meetings. The vintage nibs are increasingly difficult to obtain since they are not made any longer. And now we offer our penstaffs "to your specifications" - you choose the shaft length, size and nib holder to accommodate your special nib. Just let me know your preferences by email or phone and we'll have them at the next meeting.

The Phantom

Another great tool is the "Phantom Line Guide" which projects lines on your paper and envelopes without any electrical connection – it uses the existing light available. A bit tricky to learn to use, but once you get the hang of it, it will save you many hours of tedious line drawing and then coming back to erase. This item can be used on any paper – even those that you can't see thru.

The September program



by Alisa Golden




If you have an interest in making background papers or possibly a book, I feel that *Painted Paper* will appeal to you – whether you are “seasoned” or a beginner with painting papers.

For the beginner, the author provides clear and concise explanations of the different elements (papers, boards, inks, acrylic paints, dies, pigments, etc) one needs to get started.

For the “seasoned” artist beautiful examples are sure to inspire you and have you looking at all kinds of items to “paint” with (sticks, string, toothpicks, pieces of corrugated boxes, craft sticks and even jar lids)!

Alisa tells the reader what works for her, but encourages you to play and figure out what works best for you. I’m hoping that I will soon have the opportunity to try some of the techniques and projects for myself.

Spotlight on Jeri Wright




I work full time as a sales and marketing rep for a large electronics distributor in Plano and look forward to spending my spare time in the evenings and weekends on my lettering. I was



