



# Harvey's Helpful Hints

**The Brush Off** An engineer's dust brush is a very useful and handy tool to have close by your work area to sweep crumbles, erasures, etc. off your writing surface. Just make sure ALL your ink is completely dry before using it or you'll have a lot of new erasing to do (or start over).

**Take the Fork** A quick and easy way to line an envelope is to draw a fork across the envelope. The lines are virtually invisible, but give you lines to write on without pencil and erasing.

**Recycle** Recycle the round coffee creamers you get in a restaurant - they are perfect for ink and gouache. Also the round/clear McCormick spice containers for storing, etc.

**Hey, Mister** Keep a water mister handy when using acrylic paint on fabric. The paint generally dries very quickly and the mister will help prevent this from happening.

**Lighten Up** When mixing gouache colors always start with the lighter color first...it is much harder to lighten dark colors as opposed to darken lighter colors. Start with a white palette and gouache about the size of a pea - then go from there.

**No Tipping** Never roll the brush to a point in your mouth - some paints are hazardous and toxic (cadmium, cobalt and Vermillion). Roll the brush tip on a wet piece of paper shipping tape instead. AND NEVER PUT CHINESE INK IN YOUR MOUTH - some makers use snake venom as a binder

**Good Gouache** A good gouache formula : ½ inch gouache, 2 drops rubbing alcohol, 10 drops gum Arabic, and distilled water to the consistency you like (about like cream).

**File This** Ask your manicurist for the flexible FINE nail files. Sometimes they have multiple grits on them. Keep them handy for sharpening your pen nibs - they are a great time saver and you will always have a sharp nib. Be safe and keep a 10x loupe handy also to check the nib after sharpening - take the same amount of metal off each side to get as sharp as you like them.

**Tasty Glue** Homemade envelope glue recipe: 1 T vinegar, 1 T white Elmer's glue, 2 drops peppermint extract.

**Need A Tip** *NOTE: If you are in need of vintage nibs, my hand-made penstoffs and calligraphic dvd's, look me up at the meetings. I carry several different vintage nibs with me to the meetings. If there are specific nibs that you want, let me know in advance by phone or email and I'll bring them to the meeting (or will be happy to mail them to you). While at the round robin back in June, some of us were discussing the frustration of not being able to put the caps securely on the end of a Pilot Parallel pen when using it. It's frustrating because when you get finished and wish to "cap" the pen, you can never find the wayward cap!

They just goofed up and made it so the cap is too large and doesn't stay seated on the pen's handle! I started thinking about it and discovered some cheap pencil eraser tips at Walmart. For 88¢ I bought a package of 25 and slipped them on the end of the pen. They were the right size and stayed securely on the tip and held the cap in place till I needed to replace it on the pen! VOILA! Not perfect, but very workable and handy!






