Recting Highlights

Board Meeting Minutes – February 25, 2017 Submitted by Jeri Wright, Secretary

- Nominating Committee is canvassing membership for office of Vice-President and Treasurer. Slate will be presented at the April guild meeting.
- At the SWCC meeting in Fort Worth in January, Kaligrafos announced its withdrawal from the council. With the information available on the internet, it seemed a waste of monies to pay for two people to travel each year and for the host guild to spend the necessary funds.
- Kaligrafos has committed to working with the Austin and Waco guild in the sharing of each guild's local talent. Betty Barna and Thomas Burns will be traveling to Austin to each teach a daylong class for that guild.
- Austin is planning a local TreeWhispers exhibit and has invited Kaligrafos to participate. To find information about Pam Paulsrud's original traveling TreeWhispers collaboration using round, handmade papers which may include text and/or imagery, see Treewhispers.com.
- Three calligraphic exhibits are planned for Kaligrafos this year. The first one takes place later in March at Artist's Showplace in Richardson. Haiku verses are a suggested topic for artwork.
- Board members will be sporting a new guild T-shirt with Kaligrafos logo (designed by Janell Wimberly) to the March meeting. It is hoped this will generate interest within the membership to go forward with a new order and possible design challenge.
- Visogoth Versals workshop with Risa Gettler is scheduled for April 29th & 30th, 2017. Seats in this workshop are still open. See Sherry Barber to sign up.
- It was decided that the mini-workshops will be continued throughout next year.

HARVEY'S HELPFUL HINT'S By Harvey Anton

So many beautiful cards! A "TREMENDOUS "thanks" to all who sent, cards, calls, good wishes, prayers and thoughts for my healing. Evidently it works, I am home now, and getting better everyday.

This month's vintage nib spotlight is on the SPEELMAN #3 flexible nib and the SPENCERIAN #37M nibs. Yes, there are other good Spencerian nibs beside the #1. The #37 Spencerian quite nice with good spring, not as flexible as the #1, but better on more rough paper. And the Speelman #3 is in this same class-not as springy, but extremely long wearing. Try both if you have a heavier "hand".

Try this one: Clean dried ink from your nibs by rubbing a #2 graphite pencil lead on the dried ink. The graphite polishes the metal and helps prevent rusting. This Hint might even save your nib from further damage...

Always practice on the best paper you can afford. When purchasing paper if possible purchase at least two or more sheets (in case of errors). If you line your papers in pencil, line more than one sheet – in case you err you have a second sheet available, already lined, so that you don't lose your rhythm. A note on achieving rhythm, listen to soothing music while writing. After a short time you won't even hear the music, but you will keep your rhythm. Your lettering will look much more relaxed and flowing.

And, a note on purchasing good practice paper: do as I say, not as I do: Reminds me of a time I was stippling 15th century capital letters on a poor sheet of paper. It started out okay, and I liked what was happening. But by then, I wouldn't, quit on the poor sheet of paper. I still have the project and, it still looks okay. But, if it had been done on a decent sheet of paper, it would have looked nice enough to be matted and framed.

Make your transparent colored ink look better by adding Pro-White. This will reduce the transparency and will look great on dark papers. Of course, add a few drops at a time to the ink to get the desired effect...

If you do not have a good paper cutter yet, and can afford it, by all means get one. They are not expensive, and you will find yourself using it more than you might think. I prefer the Fiskars rotary cutter as opposed to the guillotine type cutter (for obvious reasons). The guillotine cutter will cut more sheets at a time, but there is too much chance of losing a finger even though they furnish a hand (finger) guard. And, the more sheets you cut at a time will be too ragged and uneven to use.

When opening stuck caps on tubes and bottles, NEVER use a pair of pliers for this job – use a "nutcracker" instead. The jaws of the nutcracker are more parallel than the pliers and won't crack the plastic caps as easily. This doesn't sound like a big deal until you crack the lid on your inkbottle.



The Gallery encourages you to submit your best depiction or interpretation of this theme for inclusion into its October, 2017 exhibition. *First Fruits* will celebrate the gifts and blessings of God which you have personally experienced. From ancient times Scripture tells of celebrations where the people have brought offerings of their first fruits to bless and honor our Lord. What are your fruits or gifts or blessings? We look forward to seeing how your creativity embraces the theme of *First Fruits!* 

**ARTISTS:** Please submit up to two entries to the juried competition which incorporate your interpretation of the theme of the exhibit. Selected artists will be featured in the month long exhibition in Goodrich Gallery at First United

Methodist Church in the heart of the Arts District in downtown Dallas, and receive recognition on the church website. An Opening Reception honoring the artists will be held Sunday, October 1, 2017, 12:00 to 2:00 following the worship service. During the exhibition visitors will have an opportunity to cast ballots for the People's Choice Award. On Sunday, October 29, 2017, at 12:30, the top three winners will be announced, with a prize award going to the overall winner. At that time exhibitors may take any unsold art work with them.

To enter please submit your entry in the attached form by Midnight, Tuesday, August 1, 2017 for consideration of participating in the juried art exhibition. Please review the following requirements to be considered for the show. Acceptance letters will be sent via email on Monday, August 21, 2017.

- Please title your file like this: title, size, artist.jpg.
- Upload entry specifications: Maximum width 2500px wide at 72dpi/ 180dpi. Accepted artists will be featured through our online media.
- Submit a headshot in addition to your artwork for publicity purposes. Please include your name, medium and website url.
- All 2D work must be suitably framed and wired for hanging. Gallery wrapped canvas is also acceptable. Work should not exceed 48"x48".
- Art work must be original. Work done in a production studio, classes or workshops, work from kits, commercial designs, and derivative work is prohibited. All work must be new and not previously shown at the Goodrich Gallery.
- Work may be offered for sale or marked NFS on the entry form. The Gallery will retain 25% of any sales. Please take this into consideration when determining the sales price. Sales tax is the responsibility of the artist.
- Artists must include in the online registration a statement describing how the entry relates to the theme *First Fruits*.
- Acceptance letters will include important dates and an exhibition contract to be completed and returned via email or fax to Music & Arts office in First United Methodist Church. (Rejection notification emails will follow promptly.)
- Insurance of art work is the responsibility of the artist.
- Work must have index card with artist's name, title of work, price and contact information attached to the back of the work.
- All art work must be delivered to the Music and Arts office, 1928 Ross Ave., Dallas, TX 75201, on Thursday, September 21, 2017, between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. If there is a conflict please call
