

Janell's presentation expanded the notes with tons of samples of her own antiqued papers and lots of pictures projected onscreen to show the process.

She explained to us why ordinary butcher paper is one of her favorites to work with, and presented several products that she uses to finish and protect her work. She also told us several uses for the finished product.

When Janell asked the group how many might be interested in a workshop covering the process, I think every single hand in the room was enthusiastically raised into the air. So Janell, the ball is now in your court --- just tell us where and when!

Italic Minuscules with Kathy Setina By Lynette Broiles

On March 9^a, 2019, Kathy Setina presented a mini-workshop on Italic Minuscules or the lower case letters.

Each participant received an envelope constructed with beautiful wallpaper. These held the Italic alphabet, samples of work done in variations of Italic letters, as well as lined pages for different nib sizes.

Kathy provided information on the degree of slant and the correct pen angles. She then took the participants through each letter.

It was a very organized and systematic presentation. Kathy's supervision and corrective instruction was good for those with no experience to those needing a refresher course.




















Layering with Letters – Roann Mathias



Roann Mathias is a mixed media artist specializing in calligraphy. She designs greeting cards and calendars for Conception Abbey's Printery House. She teaches calligraphy and mixed media workshops throughout the US and Canada. Her work has been published in Somerset Studio Magazine, Letter Arts Review and exhibited nationally. She was recently chosen by Cloth Paper Scissors magazine as 2012 Artisan of the Year in Art Journaling and Bookmaking.

For the past 30 years she has taken workshops from all the major calligraphers, and has taken Reggie Ezell's Yearlong class 4 times! She was on the faculty of Island Magic conference in 2007, and taught miniworkshops at the Chicago and Dallas conferences.





In this workshop, you will learn how to create multiple layers using text. This kind of layering creates interesting patterns, as well as a sense of depth in your art. Using gesso, acrylic paint and acrylic mediums on paper, we will paint on and scrape out letterforms. Neuland will be the primary style of lettering for this class, so there will be time spent reviewing that hand. We will also use italic, foundational and blackletter to add variety.
