Have a wonderful summer and don't forget to keep writing! Take the summer to learn a new lettering style, a new background process or join in on a fun on-line calligraphy class.





## Blackletter, A Year Long Study By Cynthia Stiles

Cynthia Stiles will share her experience in the intensive year-long course with Paul Antonio. The focus of the "Calligraphy from a Paleographical Perspective" course was to learn how illuminated manuscripts were written in the Medieval Period. The course involved learning the origins of the blackletter hands, how to produce the different blackletter styles both in minuscule and majuscule forms, producing decorated letters and using different forms of gold gilding as related to the manuscripts.

# Digitalizing Calligraphy with Photoshop Elements By Trish Manche

Sherry Barber shared a wonderful presentation on Digitalizing Your Calligraphy through the use of Photoshop Elements as well as providing some great handouts.

For demonstration purposes, Sherry created and scanned a piece. She used a Wacom tablet with a pen to manipulate it. However, a computer or other device with a mouse would work as well.

She began by editing her piece using layers for both picture and lettering, keeping the original unchanged. These separate layers allowed greater flexibility for adding and removing elements. She showed how to refine thicks and thins and how to replace not-so-good letters with better ones by simply dropping a good letter in. For example, your 'a' or 'y' may be inconsistent but you can solve that with this tool.


For a colorful background you can scribble and blur to fit the space. Note the beautiful background above in the title of this article.

Sherry distributed some cute Easter and birthday card samples to all of us attendees.

The best way to learn this tool is just to jump right in. Sherry mentioned in her instructions there are a large amount of "How to" user videos out on You Tube to help you get started or get through an issue. She specifically mentioned Howtogurus.com.

Watching her manipulate her piece was awesome. I can't wait to find some spare time to play on it and see what I can learn. Thank you Sherry for sharing your amazing wizardry with us!







## Layering Text Workshop with Roann Mathias By Angie Vangalis

A weekend loaded with lots of mediums and layered letters began on Saturday morning as we took out our Parallel Pens (size 6 - blue cap) and followed along with Roann as we warmed up with the Neuland lettering style originated by Rudolph Koch. Many of us made so many letters that we ran out of ink cartridges for the Parallel Pen!

After lunch, Roann demonstrated techniques for our first layers on Strathmore Acrylic paper, size 12" x 18".


#### White China Marker

She first used a white China marker in a texturally expressive Asemic "nonsense" writing - a wordless, open semantic form of writing. The word "asemic" means "having no specific semantic content". It's a great way to include textural element in a piece of abstract art.



#### Oil Pastel

Writing capital letters or scribbling, whatever your heart fancies, oil pastel provides an excellent resist to water base media.



We used a 1/2" and 1" wide paint brushes to apply large letterforms in diluted Matte Medium.

#### Gesso

Roann provided little squirt bottles with caps containing 3 parts Gesso to 1 part water, so the solution was thick enough to stand up to the upcoming layers of paint. Gesso takes the longest time to dry.

Once we completed our first layers and set them aside to dry, Roann demonstrated a glazing technique. The color is mixed with matte medium and applied to the paper with a brush. Glazing color over the first layer reveals the writing when she wiped the glaze away with a cloth rag. The result was color-stained paper and the lettering resisted the color from the mediums applied earlier.

The last technique of the day was carving letters out of a thick Acrylic Matte Medium mixed with tube acrylic applied using a credit card or palette knife and letters carved out with an Automatic Pen.

Each participant had at least two sample sheets to show their efforts by the end of the day.

Sunday, Roann covered layout tips including the Rule of Thirds and where to put the center of interest within a composition. She also shared a technique using molding paste and stencils (with stencils she made from her own stencils). Letters can also be carved out of molding paste. Molding paste is thicker than any other medium used and can also be painted.

We produced at least two more 12" x 18" pieces being conscious of the layout using all the techniques we learned. We also had the opportunity to layer largely on a really large piece of Canson XL Mixed Media paper. Arches Text wove would have been a better choice, however the XL paper proved to be a good economic option.

Everyone walked away with some really nice work and paint all over their hands!!


