This community project helps children that have been affected by family violence to give their moms a lovely card for Mother's Day.

Our March meeting will be full of learning opportunities as Tom Burns demonstrates the Pointed Pen Uncial alphabet. This style can be achieved using a straight or oblique pen staff. If you feel up to following along as Tom demos these fun letters, bring appropriate pen, paper and ink. This program is demonstration only, not individually instructional so you will hear the basics information to go forth and give it a try on your own. After the meeting and program, Tom will then be teaching our mini-workshop entitled Weaver Writing modified from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. This is a fun lettering style that is a good starting point for learning to use the pointed pen. If you haven't signed up, you'll be missing the fun!






