Scholarship Announcement for Legacies |||

KALIGRAFOS CALLIGRAPHY GUILD ALAN FURBER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FOR LEGACIES III CALLIGRAPHY CONFERENCE July 3-10, 2021

Kaligrafos Calligraphy Guild will be offering a scholarship through the guild's Alan Furber scholarship fund for Legacies III. In following Kaligrafos' mission statement to promote the study, practice and appreciation of calligraphy, with an emphasis on education, we are offering one scholarship to be issued for payment of a week-long tuition to Legacies III International Calligraphy conference that will be held in the Dallas metroplex in July of 2021. The amount of this scholarship will be a maximum of \$1500, which will be used to cover cost of a double occupancy tuition or commuter rate tuition, whichever is preferred by winner. (Does not cover any extras such as supplies, breakout sessions, etc.)

These funds will be made payable to Legacies III registration in the winner's name. The scholarship is non-transferable. Should the winner be unable to attend the conference, the scholarship will be awarded to the runner up.

The judges panel will be persons not associated with Kaligrafos Calligraphy Guild, but have calligraphic knowledge. All applications will be assigned numbers before going to the judges. The judges will have no knowledge of the applicants' names. The names of the judges will be known only to the scholarship chairman.

Applicants of all skill levels will receive equal consideration. The application form will be available to the membership in August.

RULES OF ELEGIBILITY:

. An applicant must be a member in good standing with Kaligrafos for the last five (5) consecutive years and current dues paid for the 2021-2022 guild year.

. Applicant must be 18 years of age at the time of the conference.

. The recipient should plan to give back to Legacies III by volunteering and assisting at the conference during that week.

. The recipient will be asked to give a brief review, during a guild meeting, recounting their week's activities; such as class subjects, samples of their work, other items of interest that they took with them as a result of attending.
