It is also approaching time for membership renewal. Be sure not to forget to renew when you get your reminder so you get your handmade name tag and your name in next year's membership directory.


Bring things you have been working on to display on the back table at the meeting to inspire others (and maybe show off just a tiny bit)! We are all curious about how creative members are.

#### APRIL PROGRAM - TUNNEL BOOKS

Presented by Lissette Landauro

NOTE: The handout for this program will be emailed to all members a few days before the April meeting. Please keep an eye out for this, print it, and bring it to the meeting.

#### Supply list

- 6 to 8 pieces of 4" x 4" paper for the panels. (I use Canson 180gr paper)
- 2 pieces of 4" x 8" paper for the accordions sides.
- 2 pieces of 4 1/8" x 4 1/8" board for the front and back covers, optional. (I use 1.5mm white or gray board)
- 2 pieces of 5 1/2" x 5 1/2" decorative paper for the covers, optional.
- Pencil
- Metal Ruler
- X-acto Knife
- Scissors
- PVA glue
- Glue brush
- Paper plate or similar for the glue
- Bone folder
- Cutting mat
- Spare paper to glue on



#### **About Lissette**

Lissette Landauro is a Peruvian architect who found an inspiring discipline in calligraphy.

Interested in the study and appropriation of light, she has found in the manipulation of three-dimensionality and volume a method of her own that combines calligraphy and lettering with other techniques, resulting in a personal and modern expression marked by the interdisciplinary.

Lissette is a founding member of the Peruvian Calligraphy Association -Caligráfica, where she promotes the development of calligraphy in her country.

# March Program: The Art of Daily Creative Practice by Roxanne Glaser

Roxanne Glaser, also known as Super Doodle Girl, gave our March program about the Art of Daily Creative Practice. She got her start in daily creative practice as a way to cope with and process grief. First after the passing of her husband in 2015, and later her sister, her cat, and later still after a house fire on Christmas Eve, she found that making time for daily creative practice was healing. "The colors would



soothe my heart and bring me joy when I felt so horrible." She first started by doodling in her griefshare notebook, and later shifted to more structured approaches.







In 2018, Roxanne started a 100-day project with friends, where she wrote the Lord's Prayer a different way for 100 days. She enjoyed both the challenge and comfort of writing the same thing in a new way each time. She learned that "constraints bring freedom", and took that idea into additional 100-day projects.



Though she has many tools for her creative practice, Roxanne advocates for simplicity in tools as a constraint. One notebook was filled with only black Sakura Glaze pen. She likes using a bound notebook so she can go back and flip through her work without shuffling through or losing individual papers. She had one handmade notebook which she showed to the maker of the notebook, who was delighted to see it filled with something rather than left empty.



As for making *daily* practice a habit, the program included discussion on choosing the time and space to dedicate to daily creative practice. Roxanne advocated for portability as a beneficial feature of a daily practice kit. She showed us some pouches full of supplies, accompanied by a notebook, that she will take with her on the go. Roxanne gave us six ideas for daily practice:

- 1. Repeat the content, change the tools.
- 2. Repeat the tools, change the content
- 3. Draw the same thing 10 times in a row and then switch.
- 4. Alternate dominant and non-dominant hand: "It can be crooked, it can be shaky, it's delightful."
- 5. Practice a specific number of things.
- 6. Practice one thing for a specific amount of time.



If it all seems too impossible, she shared with us advice she gave to an overwhelmed new mom who wanted to start a daily creative practice: get the smallest journal possible, limit yourself to one tool, and go from there!






















## ARTIST SPOTLIGHT

## Roxanne Glaser

- 1. Brief introduction. I am Roxanne Glaser, known as Super Doodle Girl. I'm an artist, speaker, yogi, and educator on a mission to help people get unstuck using creative tools and techniques. After experiencing debilitating grief, I turned to daily creative meditation and doodling as a way to heal. I share the healing power of tapping into creativity through lettering, doodling, and yoga. I offer workshops, speak at events, and have authored books guiding others using the methods that helped me persevere after a house fire in 2022. My art and teachings empower people to reconnect with their authentic selves.
- 2. How did I get started in calligraphy (journaling/art)? I attended a brush lettering class taught by Jeanne Dittmann from the Waco Guild in the spring of 2016. I was hooked! I remember filling pages of lowercase Os, and Jeanne would point out one or two that were showing promise! I started my love of letters, though, as a young child, when we used to have paper book covers. I would flip the paper for a blank canvas to cover with doodles and graffiti-style lettering.
- 3. How did I hear about Kaligrafos? I am a member of the Waco Guild, so I am familiar with various guilds around Texas. I also met several members in 2020 when I attended the yearlong Principles of Design class taught by Cora Pearl.
- 4. What is my favorite medium to use? My current favorite medium is watercolor with various black inks in a bound watercolor or mixed media journal. I love how portable it is for journaling when I travel or cheer on my grandson at his baseball games.
- 5. What is my favorite tool? My favorite tools are a good quality bound journal with watercolor paper and the black Glaze pen by Sakura. My favorite journals are the Handbook Journal Co. Watercolor paper and

the Strathmore journals with either 400 or 500 series paper. I also love the Fabriano Venezia Book and Indigo Artpapers WiroPad. I buy Glaze pens in boxes of 12 at a time and use them up quickly.

6. What do I do with my calligraphy(journals/art)? My daily artwork is ephemeral, created to soothe my heart and calm my mind. I share videos online to inspire others to take small steps in daily creativity. I have been a "GriefShare Fairy" and would collect small quotes and art to give goody baskets to those grieving. I also enjoy creating large acrylic paintings and have filled up my house with them. My grandkids commented that it feels like an art museum, which delights my heart.
